FINDINGS AND ORDER

The Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, sitting as the drainage authority for County Ditch 50, having received a petition to repair portions of County Ditch 50, pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 103E.715, having noticed and conducted a public hearing on the Petition for Repair, and

based on the record and proceedings, it was moved and seconded for the adoption of the following Findings and Order:

Findings:

1. A Repair Petition dated June 11, 2019 was received by the Blue Earth County Property and Environmental Resources Department for repair to portions of County Ditch 50.
2. Blue Earth County Drainage Authority is the drainage authority for County Ditch 50 public drainage system.
3. The area petitioned for partial repair was petitioned by Gordon Kuznia, 1208 Crystal Lake Ct., Lake Crystal, MN, 56055.
4. The area of petitioned repair includes Branch 13 of the original County Ditch 50 public drainage system. A detailed map of area for repair is included.
5. The drainage authority, by order, set a public hearing for review of the engineer's repair report on March 2, 2021 and directed the Property and Environmental Resources Department to provide at least 10 days advance notice, by mail, of the time and location of the hearing to the petitioners, political subdivisions, and owners of property likely to be affected by the proposed project.
6. Notice of the public hearing was properly provided as required by law.
7. At the public hearing, the engineer presented the repair report.
8. Blue Earth County Property and Environmental Resources Department staff, determined from in-field inspections as well as from the engineer's report, that in the best interest of the affected landowners, a repair to Branch 13 and Lateral P is necessary.
9. On December 18, 2020, the engineer filed the repair report with Blue Earth County Property and Environmental Resources Department staff.
10. On January 29, 2021, an informal landowner meeting was held virtually to discuss the engineer's repair report, which included repair costs and multiple repair options. A copy of the repair report is included as part of the Findings and Order.
11. Public comment was heard during the proceedings.
12. The proposed drainage repair will be of public utility and benefit and will promote the public health.

Order:

Based on the foregoing Findings and the entire record of proceedings before the Board, the Board, acting as the drainage authority for County Ditch 50, hereby orders as follows:

1. The Blue Earth County Drainage Authority orders the repair of County Ditch 50 as recommended by the engineer, for both Branch 13 and Lateral P.
2. The Blue Earth County Drainage Authority directs the engineer to prepare the detailed plans and specifications and other necessary documents to allow for the public bidding on the repair.

**RESOLUTION RELATING TO
FINANCING OF CERTAIN PROPOSED PROJECTS TO BE UNDERTAKEN
BY THE COUNTY; ESTABLISHING COMPLIANCE WITH REIMBURSEMENT
BOND REGULATIONS UNDER THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE**

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners (the “Board”) of Blue Earth County, Minnesota (the “County”), as follows:

- 1. Recitals.**
 - (a) The Internal Revenue Service has issued Section 1.150-2 of the Income Tax Regulations (the “Regulations”) dealing with the issuance of bonds, all or a portion of the proceeds of which are to be used to reimburse the County for project expenditures made by the County prior to the date of issuance.
 - (b) The Regulations generally require that the County make a declaration of its official intent to reimburse itself for such prior expenditures out of the proceeds of a subsequently issued series of bonds within 60 days after payment of the expenditures, that the bonds be issued and the reimbursement allocation be made from the proceeds of such bonds within the reimbursement period (as defined in the Regulations), and that the expenditures reimbursed be capital expenditures or costs of issuance of the bonds.
 - (c) The County desires to comply with requirements of the Regulations with respect to certain projects hereinafter identified.
- 2. Official Intent Declaration.**
 - (a) The County proposes to undertake the following project or projects and to make original expenditures with respect thereto prior to the issuance of reimbursement bonds, and reasonably expects to issue reimbursement bonds for such project or projects in the maximum principal amounts shown below:

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CD50 Repair Petition Branch 13 & Lateral P	\$369,000.00
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(b) Other than (i) de minimis amounts permitted to be reimbursed pursuant to Section 1.150-2(f)(1) of the Regulations or (ii) expenditures constituting preliminary expenditures as defined in Section 1.150-2(f)(2) of the Regulations, the County will not seek reimbursement for any original expenditures with respect to the foregoing projects paid more than 60 days prior to the date of adoption of this resolution. All original expenditures for which reimbursement is sought will be capital expenditures or costs of issuance of the reimbursement bonds.

3. Budgetary Matters.

As of the date hereof, there are no County funds reserved, pledged, allocated on a long term basis or otherwise set aside (or reasonably expected to be reserved, pledged, allocated on a long term basis or otherwise set aside) to provide permanent financing for the original expenditures related to the projects, other than pursuant to the issuance of the reimbursement bonds. Consequently, it is not expected that the issuance of the reimbursement bonds will result in the creation of any replacement proceeds.

4. Reimbursement Allocations.

The County’s Financial officer shall be responsible for making the “reimbursement allocations” described in the Regulations, being generally the transfer of the appropriate amount of proceeds of the reimbursement bonds to reimburse the source of temporary financing used by the County to make payment of the original expenditures relating to the projects. Each reimbursement allocation shall be made within 30 days of the date of issuance of the reimbursement bonds, shall be evidenced by an entry on the official books and records of the county maintained for the reimbursement bonds and shall specifically identify the original expenditures being reimbursed.

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The Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, sitting as the Drainage Authority for County Ditch 48 (CD 48), having received the engineer's report and notice that the contract for construction of the Improvement of CD 48 is complete pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 103E.555, having noticed and conducted a hearing on the petition, and based on the record and proceedings, a motion was made and seconded, to adopt the following Findings and Order:

Findings:

1. By order dated December 12, 2017, the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners established the Improvement to CD 48 in Blue Earth County.
2. Upon advertised bids, the drainage authority awarded a contract for construction to Gustafson Drainage LLC, Lake Crystal, Minnesota.
3. Concurrent with the proceedings to establish the drainage project, the drainage authority appointed viewers for the purpose of determining benefits and damages for the project as well as a Redetermination of Benefits for Blue Earth County CD 48.
4. In the proceedings, damages were awarded based on the impact construction of the system had on adjacent properties and to account for the future burden and entry for ongoing maintenance and inspection of the system.

5. Upon completion of construction of the Improvement of CD 48, the project engineer inspected the construction and prepared a report to the drainage authority showing the contract price, the amount paid on certificates, the unpaid balance, and the work that is completed under the contract.
6. The engineer has concluded that the work was performed according to the plans and specifications for the improvement, was performed within the right of way for which damages have been determined and paid for the construction and future maintenance of the system, and was performed by the contractor in a timely and workmanlike manner by the contractor.
7. The engineer has concluded that all amounts under the contract, including change orders and penalties, if any, have been duly paid to the contractor and that any retainage should be released to the contractor as provided in the contract.
8. Upon receipt of the engineer's report, the auditor set a time and location for a hearing on the report, gave notice of the hearing by mail to affected landowners, by posting on the Blue Earth County website and by posting at the meeting place at least ten days before the hearing, and included an invitation in the notice that a party objecting to the acceptance of the contract may appear and be heard.
9. The hearing was opened for public comment.
10. The contract has been completed in accordance with the plans and specifications.

Order:

Based on the foregoing Findings and the entire record of proceedings before the Board, the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, sitting as the Drainage Authority for CD 48, hereby orders as follows:

1. The contract herein is accepted as complete.
2. Any retainage under the contract shall be released to the contractor upon proof of release of all liens of contractors or material related to the project.
3. The Blue Earth County Property & Environmental Resources Department is ordered to pay the balance due on the contract, if any, and the costs of the improvement as provided by Minn. Stat. ch. 103E.

PLANNING AND ZONING

Mr. George Leary, Land Use Administrator, presented the following item to the Board:

Chair Bruender opened the public comment portion of the hearing. There being no comments, the public comment portion of the hearing was closed.

Commissioner Paap moved and Commissioner Piepho seconded the motion to approve the following:

RESOLUTION GRANTING APPROVAL OF A CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT TO EXPAND AN EXISTING FEEDLOT BY CONSTRUCTING ONE SWINE FINISHING BARN. THE APPLICANT WILL CONSTRUCT ONE SWINE FINISHING BARN CAPABLE OF HOUSING 1,200 HEAD OF SWINE BETWEEN 55 AND 300 POUNDS OR 360 ANIMAL UNITS AND WILL FEATURE A BELOW BARN CONCRETE LIQUID MANURE STORAGE AREA. THE FACILITY WILL HAVE A CAPACITY OF 3,600 HEAD OF SWINE BETWEEN 55 AND 300 POUNDS OR 1,080 ANIMAL UNITS. THE PROPERTY IS ZONED AGRICULTURAL AND IS LOCATED IN THE SOUTHEAST QUARTER OF THE NORTHWEST QUARTER OF SECTION 29, BUTTERNUT VALLEY TOWNSHIP. (T-108-N, R-29-W)

WHEREAS, Steven and Daniel Roberts, owners of the following real estate in the County of Blue Earth, Minnesota, to wit:

That part of the Southeast Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of Section 29, Butternut Valley Township, Blue Earth County, Minnesota, as shown on Attachment A – Location Map.

WHEREAS, the Planning Agency of the County has completed a review of the application and made a report pertaining to said request (PC 06-21), a copy of said report has been presented to the Planning Commission; and,

WHEREAS, the request to allow a feedlot is consistent with the Land Use Plan, and Agricultural Zoning District Conditional Uses, as authorized by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners; and,

WHEREAS; the Planning Commission of the County on the 3rd Day of March 2021, following proper notice held a public hearing regarding the request, and following due consideration of presented testimony and information, voted unanimously to forward the matter to the County Board with a recommendation for approval subject to conditions contained in staff report PC 06-21 and,

WHEREAS; the County Board on the 23rd Day of March 2021, held a public hearing regarding the request, and following due consideration of presented testimony and information, voted unanimously to approve the request subject to conditions contained in staff report PC 06-21 and,

WHEREAS, the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners finds:

1. The Land Use Plan supports agriculture, and agricultural operations. Since this proposal exceeds setback standards and features below-barn liquid manure storage areas, there are no conflicts with the Land Use Plan.
2. The applicant would be unable to expand the feedlot operation without the granting of the Conditional Use Permit, for this reason the need exists.
3. Manure and washwater will be stored in a below-barn liquid manure storage area. This manure storage area has been designed and will be inspected by a licensed engineer. Manure and washwater will be land applied in accordance with Blue Earth County and

Minnesota Pollution Control Agency standards. If all setbacks and standards are followed, the proposal should not degrade the water quality of the county.

4. While the construction of new buildings and driveways has the potential to increase water runoff, county officials will monitor the site to prevent any pollution hazards from construction, manure application, the operation of the feedlot, and any other factors in the future. The project will be required to follow MPCA Best Management Practices to reduce any runoff concerns.
5. County staff has reviewed the site for any potential wetland impacts and did not have any concerns with the proposal. The applicant has also submitted a soil borings report from ISG Engineering that shows the soils conditions are adequate for the proposed barn with below barn liquid manure storage area.
6. The site will be monitored in the future for any pollution hazards by the Blue Earth County Feedlot Officer and the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency. Any potential pollution hazards will be addressed on a case by case basis.
7. Access to the feedlot will come from an existing access on to CSAH 22 (478th Avenue). All other utilities and facilities are already on site.
8. There is adequate space on site to provide off street parking to serve the proposed use.
9. While there may be some increase in traffic for the expanded use, it should not create any congestion. Parking will be on the driveways for the barn, so there should not be any hazards created from on-street parking.
10. The proposed barn meets all setbacks, does not exceed maximum capacity standards, and are located in the Agricultural Zoning District where animal feedlots are a Conditional Use. These facts, also considering that neighboring property uses are also agricultural, confirm that the granting of this Conditional Use Permit will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other properties in the area.
11. Neighboring properties are predominantly cropland. Any future residential development would be required to adhere to feedlot-dwelling setback standards, but non-residential development would not be limited by any further setbacks.
12. The applicant will be required to follow all Blue Earth County and Minnesota Pollution Control Agency regulations regarding feedlot construction and operation. The feedlot will also exceed all feedlot-dwelling setbacks, and building setbacks as established by the Blue Earth County Zoning Ordinance.
13. The Planning Commission and County Board have the authority to grant this permit with conditions. There are a number of conditions that Staff recommends be accepted, those conditions have been included in this report.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, that the Conditional Use Permit is hereby **granted** with the following conditions:

1. That the total confinement barn conforms to the site plan attached to this report PC 06-21.
2. That the feedlot be located on a single, legally described parcel consisting of a minimum of 10 contiguous acres. The parcel shall be a parcel of record, properly recorded in the Blue Earth County Taxpayer Services Office. Any future division of this property shall first be reviewed for compliance with county subdivision regulations.
3. That the applicant must update their Blue Earth County Feedlot Permit before any animals are placed in the barn.
4. That the applicant obtains a Blue Earth County Construction Permit before building begins and within one (1) year from the date the County Board of Commissioners approves the Conditional Use Permit. The permit shall be rendered invalid if application for a Construction Permit is not made within this one (1) year period. Time extensions for Conditional Use Permits must be obtained from the County Board of Commissioners subsequent to a public hearing conducted by the Planning Commission.
5. That a perimeter footing drain tile be located at or below the bottom of the pit footings. The footing tile shall include one inspection pipe for each concrete pit. The native materials must be excavated and walls back filled with granular material (pit run gravel or equivalent). *Exceptions to this may only include specific design standards submitted by the design engineer of the manure storage structure.*
6. The application of manure shall comply with standards set forth by the MPCA and the County. The applicants manure management plan must be reviewed by the operator each year and updated each year and adjusted for any changes in the amount of manure production, manure nutrient test results and transfer of manure ownership. Records of manure transfer shall be maintained as required by the MPCA. Manure application setback standards for the fields on which the manure is applied shall be followed as required by the MPCA and the County.
7. That the disposal of dead animals be consistent with the Minnesota Board of Animal Health regulations, and when rendering is used as a mortality disposal the applicant shall provide an enclosed location for the pick-up.
8. That adequate measures be taken to minimize or control offensive odor, fumes, dust, noise, or vibrations so that none of these will constitute a nuisance.
9. That all manure storage structures must be designed by a registered engineer.
10. That the applicant will furnish the final construction report to the County Environmental Services verifying that the concrete manure storage structure was constructed per approved engineered design plan within 60 days of completion of any new or modified manure storage area. Said construction report shall be signed by the design engineer.

11. That the applicant complies with the storm-water control requirements established by the MPCA.
12. That MPCA construction Best Management Practices be followed including erosion control measures.
13. That all exposed earthen surfaces be seeded into grass or utilized as crop acreage.
14. If shower, restroom, culinary and/or laundry facilities are to be included with the proposal, that wastewater handling practices are designed and constructed according to state requirements.
15. That any buried debris from the former farm site be properly disposed of (if found), and that no damage be done to the sealed well of the former farm site.

ORDINANCE AMENDMENT

TO THE BLUE EARTH COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES CHAPTER 24 – ARTICLE III (DIVISIONS 2 AND 3) TO ADD THE ACTIVITIES OF REMOVING, STOCKPILING, OR FILLING OVER 500 CUBIC YARDS OF FILL OR DISTURBING ONE ACRE OR MORE OF LAND OUTSIDE OF A PUBLIC RIGHT-OF- WAY WHEN ASSOCIATED WITH TOWNSHIP, COUNTY, STATE OR FEDERAL ROAD PROJECTS, AS A PERMITTED USE IN IN THE AGRICULTURAL AND CONSERVATION ZONED DISTRICTS

WHEREAS, Minnesota Statutes 394.21 to 394.37 gives Counties the authority to regulate land development by adopting and amending Official Controls to protect the public health, safety, and welfare: and,

WHEREAS, the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners finds:

1. Minn. Stat. § 394.21 grants counties the authority to regulate land development by adopting and amending official controls.
2. The proposed amendment is intended to address the stormwater management objectives of the County Land Use Plan to help protect the water quality of the county.
3. The proposed ordinance amendment is consistent with the County Code Land Use Plan which references the importance of an effective and efficient transportation system.
4. The proposed amendment will prevent delay of township, county, state, or federal road projects.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, that the amendments to Chapter 24 – Article III (Divisions 2 and 3) – to add the activities of removing, stockpiling, or filling over 500 cubic yards of fill or disturbing one acre or more of land outside of a public right-of-way when associated with Township, County, State or Federal road projects, as a permitted use in the Agricultural and Conservation Zoned Districts contained in Attachment A, are hereby adopted.

South Sudanese Community of Minnesota (SSCMN). The purpose of this contract is for the South Sudanese Community of Minnesota to contract with Blue Earth County in order to provide interpreting services to our clients with limited English proficiency. This contract fulfills our mandated responsibilities to our community. The rates are the same as other contracts for interpreting services. Face-to-face \$50.00 per hour base rate for first hour, and \$38.00 for additional hours. Phone interpreting is \$1.40 per minute. The term of the contract is April 1, 2021, through December 31, 2021.

Human Services Fee Policy and Procedure Manual. The purpose of this policy is to define the procedures and rates for services within the Human Services Department at Blue Earth County. This policy is reviewed and updated annually. Procedural and wording changes were made, but the overall policy remains relatively unchanged compared with previous years. All sliding fee schedules were updated with 2021 Federal Poverty Guidelines. The effective date of this agreement will be March 1, 2021.

**Blue Earth County
Guidelines for Requested Resolutions and Proclamations**

The Blue Earth County Board is a nonpartisan body that does not advocate for positions or policies that do not have a direct, unambiguous and explicit relationship to the County's programs, services, policies, or budgets. This policy provides the County Administration with guidelines in responding to requests for Resolutions. It outlines, in general the reasons for Board proclamations and resolutions.

Resolutions:

- 1. Resolutions for the County Board to take affirmative action on an item of County business such as:**

- Approval of Board minutes, County policies, procedures, and guidelines
- Approval of the annual budget, budget amendments, to establish funds, to make large purchases
- Approval to advertise for bids and proposals, to enter into contracts and agreements
- Approval of appointments of some employees and appointments to various boards and committees
- Approval of comprehensive plan, rezoning, land use permits, findings of facts, and other zoning issues
- Approval of employment policies and union agreements
- Approval of Blue Earth County elected officials' salaries, approval of official newspaper, and other annual requirements
- Establishing or dissolution of Joint Powers Agreements
- Enacting a State of Emergency
- Other actions required by State or Federal law or policy

2. Statements to Influence State and Federal Policy

- Resolutions about State policy that are directly and explicitly related to the County budget, programs and services. For example, issues of importance raised by the Association of Minnesota Counties and the Minnesota Inter-County Association, and funding of local projects and initiatives.
- Resolutions about Federal policy that are directly and explicitly related to the County budget, programs and services. For example, issues of importance raised by the National Association of Counties and funding of local projects and initiatives.

Proclamations and Resolutions will not be issued for:

- Issues in which the County Board is not required by Federal law or policy, State law or policy, or local law or policy to act upon unless identified above. For example:
 - Expressing an opinion on matters of political or ideological controversy
 - Expressing an opinion on issues generally identified and known as supported by one political party and/or opposed by a political party
 - Expressing an opinion or position on topics that have no direct, unambiguous and explicit relationship to the County's programs, services, policies, or budgets
 - Events or organizations with no explicit and unambiguous relationship to the County's programs, services, policies, or budgets
 - Campaigns or events contrary to County policies

Administration of the Guidelines:

Requests for County Board action on a resolution or proclamation will be processed by the County Administrator. The County Administrator will apply the guidelines and provide a reply to the requestor. This policy or the administration of this policy does not prevent anyone from being heard. Anyone may be heard by the County Board through contracting a Board Member or requesting to provide public comment at a Board of Commissioners meeting.
