**ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF ASSIGNMENT OF SEWER CAPACITY**

**THIS ACKNOWLEDGMENT** is intended to confirm the assignment of sewer capacity between the County of Blue Earth, Minnesota (the "County") and the City of Mankato, Minnesota (the "City"), to the Lake Washington Sanitary District (the "LWSD") (collectively the "Parties").

WHEREAS, the City and County entered into a Sewer Capacity Agreement dated January 26, 2010 ("Agreement") to facilitate the extension of sanitary sewer service around Duck Lake, Ballantyne Lake, and rural Madison Lake ("Lakes Area");

WHEREAS, the Parties contemplated an expansion of LWSD to include the Lakes Area;

WHEREAS, the Parties contemplated that the County would assign its rights and obligations under the Agreement to LWSD;

WHEREAS, the County provided the City with written notice of assignment of the Agreement on September 27, 2013;

WHEREAS, the City has not objected to the assignment of the Agreement to LWSD; and

WHEREAS, the County has reached its goal of facilitating the extension of sanitary sewer service and intends to turn over further efforts to the City and LWSD and terminate the subordinate service district.

NOW THEREFORE, the Parties acknowledge the following:

1. The County's interest in the Sewer Capacity Agreement dated January 26, 2010 is assigned to LWSD.
2. The City and LWSD shall coordinate on all issues related to the Sewer Trunk Line and any interconnection agreement or wastewater treatment agreement as contemplated in the Agreement.
3. The County will terminate the subordinate service district as deemed appropriate by the Blue Earth County Board.

Commissioner Stuehrenberg moved and Commissioner Bruender seconded the motion to approve the following resolution:

**Ordinance ADOPTING an amendment to Section 24-502 of Article VI. URBAN FRINGE OVERLAY DISTRICT (UFD) of the Blue Earth County Zoning Ordinance.**

**WHEREAS**, Minnesota Statutes 394.21 to 394.37, commonly known as the County Planning and Zoning Enabling Legislation, gives Counties the authority to regulate land development by adopting and amending Official Controls to protect the public health, safety, and welfare; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Planning Agency of the County prepared an amendment proposal and completed a report pertaining to staff report PC 01-14, a copy of said report has been presented to the Planning Commission and County Board; and,

**WHEREAS**; the Planning Commission of the County on the 8th Day of January, 2014, following proper notice held a public hearing regarding the amendment, and following due consideration of presented testimony and information, the Planning Commission unanimously voted to forward a recommendation of approval to the County Board; and,

**WHEREAS**; the County Board of Commissioners on the 21<sup>st</sup> day of January, 2014, following proper notice held a public hearing regarding the request, and following due consideration of presented testimony and information, voted to adopt the proposed amendment; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners finds that:

1. Minnesota State Statute, Chapter 394.21 gives the counties the authority to regulate land development by adopting and amending Land Use Controls.
2. Applications for conditional use permits for Level II Home Occupations require that the applicant have a pre-application meeting with the affected municipality. This is to allow proper review of the request by the municipality prior to the formal review by the County Planning Commission and County Board to ensure no negative impacts on the delivery of municipal services and to ensure the proposed use will not interfere with the orderly development of the area.
3. Allowing Level II Home occupation in the Agricultural and Conservation Zoned Districts of the UFD will be consistent with the UFD regulations of Lime Township which allows such use.
4. The proposed amendment will conform to state statutes.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners that the proposed amendment set forth below is hereby adopted.

**Article VI. URBAN FRINGE OVERLAY DISTRICT (UFD)**

**Sec. 24-502 Uses.**

(b) *Conditional uses.* The following uses may be allowed as conditional uses within the UFD, subject to the provisions of article II of this chapter:

- (1) Extraction of minerals and associated processing activities in the C, A and HI districts, subject to requirements of Sec. 24-329.
- (2) Any conditional use in the GB, HB or LI district, provided that the use is located on a lot of record in existence on the effective date of the ordinance from which this article is derived.
- (3) Buildings owned and operated by a governmental agency for a public purpose.
- (4) Essential service utility structures or buildings, including broadcasting facilities, antennas and pipelines.
- (5) Garden nurseries and greenhouses in the RR, A and C districts.
- (6) Parks, recreational areas, wildlife areas, game refuges and forest preserves.
- (7) Level I home occupations in the RR and RT districts.
- (8) Level II home occupations in the A and C districts
- (9) New feedlots over 100 animal units or the expansion of existing feedlots over 100 animal units in the A district.
- (10) Manure storage structures in the A district.
- (11) New landfills or expansion of existing landfills.
- (12) Commercial wind energy conversion system in the A zoning district, LI district, and HI district.

This amendment shall become effective after its passage and required publication.

**RESOLUTION GRANTING APPROVAL OF A CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT TO ALLOW FOR AN ELDER CARE CARE-GIVING RESIDENTIAL UNIT. THE PROPERTY IS LOCATED IN THE AGRICULTURAL AND CONSERVATION ZONED DISTRICTS IN THE NORTHWEST QUARTER OF THE NORTHWEST QUARTER OF SECTION 18, DECORIA TWP. (T-107-N; R-26-W)**

**WHEREAS**, Fred C. & Karin Bock, owners of the following real estate in the County of Blue Earth, Minnesota, to wit:

That part of the Northwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of Section 18, Decoria Twp., Township 107 North, Range 26 West, Blue Earth County, Minnesota, as shown on Attachment A – Location Map.

**WHEREAS**, the Planning Agency of the County has completed a review of the application and made a report pertaining to said request (PC 02-14), a copy of said report has been presented to the County Board; and,

**WHEREAS**; the request to allow for an elder care care-giving residential unit does not conflict with the Land Use Plan, through approval of a Conditional Use Permit authorized by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners; and,

**WHEREAS**; the Planning Commission of the County on the 8<sup>th</sup> Day of January 2014, following proper notice held a public hearing regarding the request, and following due consideration of presented testimony and information, voted unanimously to forward the matter to the County Board with a recommendation for approval subject to conditions contained in staff report PC 02-14 and,

**WHEREAS**; the County Board on the 21<sup>st</sup> Day of January 2014, held a public hearing regarding the request, and following due consideration of presented testimony and information, voted unanimously to approve the request subject to conditions contained in staff report PC 02-14 and,

**WHEREAS**, the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners finds:

1. That the proposed use conforms with the county land use plan.
2. The demonstrated need for the proposed use.
3. That the proposed use will not degrade the water quality of the county.
4. That the proposed use will not adversely increase the quantity of water runoff.
5. That soil conditions are adequate to accommodate the proposed use.
6. That the proposed use does not create a potential pollution hazard.
7. That adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and other necessary facilities have been or are being provided.
8. That adequate measures have been or will be taken to provide sufficient off-street parking and loading space to serve the proposed use.
9. That the conditional use will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted.
10. That the establishment of the conditional use will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding vacant property for predominant uses in the area.

11. That the density of proposed residential development is not greater than the density of the surrounding neighborhood or not greater than the density indicated by the applicable zoning district.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, that the request for approval of an elder care care-giving residential unit located in the Agricultural and Conservation Zoned District in the NW 1/4 of the NW 1/4 of Section 18, Decoria Township (T-107-N, R-26-W) is hereby **granted** with the following conditions:

1. Not more than one (1) elder care/dependent care unit shall be allowed on the lot.
2. Occupancy of the elder care/dependent care unit is limited to family members related by blood, marriage, or adoption and/or their care giver(s). There shall be an annual verification that the persons living in the elder care/dependent care unit are family members or the care giver(s) as defined herein.
3. Sewage treatment shall be provided for the elder care/dependent care unit in accordance with the Blue Earth County Subsurface Sewage Treatment System Ordinance.
4. In addition to the parking spaces required for the principal single family dwelling on the lot, one off-street parking space shall be provided for the elder care/dependent care unit.
5. The elder care/dependent care unit and its supporting parking area shall be served by the same driveway and access that serves the principal single family dwelling.
6. Detached Elder Care/Dependent Care Unit Setbacks. In addition to meeting principal building setbacks, the detached elder care/dependent care unit shall be located in the side or rear yard of the principal single family dwelling and be separated by at least 10 feet from the principal single family dwelling, but not more than 150 feet.
7. The elder care/dependent care unit shall not be subdivided nor otherwise segregated in ownership from the principal single family dwelling.
8. The elder care/dependent care unit shall comply with all other local and state regulations.
9. Attached or detached elder care/dependent care units must be removed within 90 days of when the unit is no longer occupied by a family member or care giver(s).
10. That an escrow account of \$5000 be established and maintained to ensure that funds are available to remove the existing residence.
11. That a construction permit be obtained before any construction activities commence on the site.

This Conditional Use Permit shall become effective immediately upon its passage and without publication.

**ROSS ARNESON VS BLUE EARTH COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS**

Commissioner Stuehrenberg moved and Commissioner Campbell seconded the motion to approve the following resolution presented as “Option 1”:

**A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING THE SALARY FOR  
THE ASSISTANT COUNTY ATTORNEYS  
FOR THE CALENDAR YEARS 2012-2013**

WHEREAS, on September 12, 2013, the District Court issued Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order (hereinafter referred to as the Order) remanding the 2012 and 2013 salary determinations for the Blue Earth Assistant County Attorneys in accordance with the District Court’s Findings of Fact and Conclusions of law; and

WHEREAS, the County Board is preparing this Resolution to submit to the District Court as directed in the Order; and

WHEREAS, Figure 4 of the Order notes that the High Salary in Blue Earth County is at \$106,891 and that this amount represents the highest salary noted in that column of Figure 4 for the 10 listed counties in the chart; and

WHEREAS, Figure 4 of the Order notes that the average salary in Blue Earth County is at \$80,365 and that this amount is 5<sup>th</sup> of the 10 listed counties in the chart; and

WHEREAS, the County Board notes that the \$106,891 amount is not a wage applicable to the Blue Earth Assistant County Attorney classification but rather more applicable to the Attorney Division Chief; and

WHEREAS in order to act upon the most accurate data available, the County Board directed staff to listed counties in order to obtain the 2013 salary information for those counties that the District Court determined were comparable, as noted in Figure 4 of the Order entitled “Similarly situated counties with similar case loads” (hereinafter referred to as comparable counties) without including Chief Assistant County Attorneys or Division Chiefs where applicable; and

WHEREAS the information obtained by the County Board on this salary information was compiled and presented to the County Board in the form of Attachment 1; and

WHEREAS, on December 31, 2013 the County Administrator also asked the County Attorney “to provide the Board with year –end caseload statistics” in order to provide a more meaningful analysis of that factor, particularly given that this information is not included in Figure 4 for Beltrami, Goodhue or Sherburne Counties. A copy of the email exchange is attached to this Resolution as Attachment 2; and

WHEREAS, the County Board determined that this response from the County Attorney prevents it from practically obtaining additional caseload statistics to more fully consider in its determination on how to comply with the Order utilizing the most recent data for 2013; and

WHEREAS, the County Board reviewed the caseload statistics noted in Figure 4 of the Order in considering and determining the 2012 and 2013 salaries but has not obtained or considered additional caseload statistics; and

WHEREAS, the County Board obtained and reviewed information from the State of Minnesota Department of Public Safety Uniform Crime Report for 2012 related to the comparable counties as determined by the Order; and

WHEREAS, the County Board review of this factor was based upon the statistics summarized in Attachment 3 (Table 1 and Table 2); and

WHEREAS, these widely ranging caseload and crime statistics do not support placing emphasis upon any one county or group of counties relative to Blue Earth County and that accordingly averages were primarily utilized in this review; and

WHEREAS in focusing on the comparable county wages, the County Board noted that 6 of the 9 comparable counties utilize different classifications to reflect the Assistant County Attorneys duties and responsibilities; and

WHEREAS, the County Board has considered that compensation related to separate classifications within the County Attorney's Office best reflects compensation for the comparable counties and has further considered how this would apply in the Blue Earth County Attorney's Office; and

WHEREAS, the County Board recognizes that the Division Chiefs in the County Attorney's Office actively represent the County and the Attorney Division Chief handling Adult Criminal Cases and the Attorney Division Chief handling CHIPS Cases, Guardianships and Administrative Appeals were both compensated at \$107,952 in 2012 and \$110,677 in 2013; and

WHEREAS, the County Board recognizes that the current division of responsibility in the County Attorney's Office is such that the duties and responsibilities of the Attorney Division Chiefs warrant higher compensation than the Assistant County Attorneys in their current classifications; and

WHEREAS, the County Board has considered that the active involvement in handling cases by the Attorney Division Chiefs is such that these classifications could be utilized in creating new classifications within the County Attorney's Office and is an option considered by the County Board; and

WHEREAS, the County Board considered the salaries paid to Assistant County Attorneys in comparable counties as noted in Attachment 1 and noted that the 2013 average low salary is \$57,670 compared to the Blue Earth County low salary of \$58,074 and that consideration of comparable counties does not warrant any change in the starting salary for a Blue Earth Assistant County Attorney; and

WHEREAS, the County Board considered that the 2013 average high salary is \$92,647 of comparable counties as noted in Attachment 1 compared to the Blue Earth County high salary of \$77,293 and that consideration of this factor potentially warrants adjustment to the high wage that a Blue Earth Assistant County Attorney may earn; and

WHEREAS, the attached documents summarize the various options considered by the Board based on the low and high compensation for comparable counties; and

WHEREAS, the County Board has determined under Option 1 and Option 2, the County would retain the same starting salary for Assistant Blue Earth County Attorney I in an amount that exceeds the average starting wage in the comparable counties; and

WHEREAS, the County Board has determined that the attached Option 1 would result in the 2013 range top as of July 1, 2013 established at \$93,018 and that this amount would exceed the average high wage in the comparable counties of \$92,647 and; and

WHEREAS, the County Board has determined that attached Option 2 would result in the 2013 range top as of July 1, 2013 established at \$100,443 and that this amount would significantly exceed the average high wage in the comparable counties of \$92,647 but would be reflective of the additional duties and responsibilities associated with an Assistant County III in terms of supervision and acting in a Lead capacity to such an extent that it would replace the Attorney Division Chiefs over time; and

WHEREAS, the County Board has determined that attached Option 2 would further recognize the division of duties and responsibilities held by the incumbent Attorney Division Chiefs as they actively practice and handle caseloads on behalf of the County Attorney's Office, would include the incumbent Attorney Division Chiefs at the Assistant County Attorney III classification but would not limit their salary to the high salary in recognition of their current duties and responsibilities and compensation; and

WHEREAS, in determining the appropriate placement of incumbent Assistant County Attorneys, the County Board recognizes that the affected incumbents had the following experience:

WHEREAS, in the event that Option 2 was selected, this County Attorney recommendation would be submitted to the County Board for individual placement in the classifications based on the employee's experience, qualifications and performance consistent with this Resolution;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the County Board hereby establishes the Assistant County Salary Determinations for budget years 2012 and 2013 as outlined in Option 1 attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference; and

The term of the contract is from January 6, 2014, through June 30, 2014.

Greater Mankato Area United Way: A contract with United Way to administer programs funded through the United Way Home Visiting and First Steps coordinator programs. The term of the agreement is January 1, 2014, through December 31, 2014.

WHEREAS, on September 12, 2013, the District Court issued Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order (hereinafter referred to as the Order) remanding the 2012 and 2013 salary determinations for the Blue Earth Assistant County Attorneys in accordance with the District Court's Findings of Fact and Conclusions of law; and

WHEREAS, the County Board is preparing this Resolution to submit to the District Court as directed in the Order; and

WHEREAS, Figure 4 of the Order notes that the High Salary in Blue Earth County is at \$106,891 and that this amount represents the highest salary noted in that column of Figure 4 for the 10 listed counties in the chart; and

WHEREAS, Figure 4 of the Order notes that the average salary in Blue Earth County is at \$80,365 and that this amount is 5<sup>th</sup> of the 10 listed counties in the chart; and

WHEREAS, the County Board notes that the \$106,891 amount is not a wage applicable to the Blue Earth Assistant County Attorney classification but rather more applicable to the Attorney Division Chief; and

WHEREAS in order to act upon the most accurate data available, the County Board directed staff to listed counties in order to obtain the 2013 salary information for those counties that the District Court determined were comparable, as noted in Figure 4 of the Order entitled "Similarly situated counties with similar case loads" (hereinafter referred to as comparable counties) without including Chief Assistant County Attorneys or Division Chiefs where applicable; and

WHEREAS the information obtained by the County Board on this salary information was compiled and presented to the County Board in the form of Attachment 1; and

WHEREAS, on December 31, 2013 the County Administrator also asked the County Attorney “to provide the Board with year –end caseload statistics” in order to provide a more meaningful analysis of that factor, particularly given that this information is not included in Figure 4 for Beltrami, Goodhue or Sherburne Counties. A copy of the email exchange is attached to this Resolution as Attachment 2; and

WHEREAS, the County Board determined that this response from the County Attorney prevents it from practically obtaining additional caseload statistics to more fully consider in its determination on how to comply with the Order utilizing the most recent data for 2013; and

WHEREAS, the County Board reviewed the caseload statistics noted in Figure 4 of the Order in considering and determining the 2012 and 2013 salaries but has not obtained or considered additional caseload statistics; and

WHEREAS, the County Board obtained and reviewed information from the State of Minnesota Department of Public Safety Uniform Crime Report for 2012 related to the comparable counties as determined by the Order; and

WHEREAS, the County Board review of this factor was based upon the statistics summarized in Attachment 3 (Table 1 and Table 2); and

WHEREAS, these widely ranging caseload and crime statistics do not support placing emphasis upon any one county or group of counties relative to Blue Earth County and that accordingly averages were primarily utilized in this review; and

WHEREAS in focusing on the comparable county wages, the County Board noted that 6 of the 9 comparable counties utilize different classifications to reflect the Assistant County Attorneys duties and responsibilities; and

WHEREAS, the County Board has considered that compensation related to separate classifications within the County Attorney’s Office best reflects compensation for the comparable counties and has further considered how this would apply in the Blue Earth County Attorney’s Office; and

WHEREAS, the County Board recognizes that the Division Chiefs in the County Attorney’s Office actively represent the County and the Attorney Division Chief handling Adult Criminal Cases and the Attorney Division Chief handling CHIPS Cases, Guardianships and Administrative Appeals were both compensated at \$107,952 in 2012 and \$110,677 in 2013; and

WHEREAS, the County Board recognizes that the current division of responsibility in the County Attorney’s Office is such that the duties and responsibilities of the Attorney Division Chiefs warrant higher compensation than the Assistant County Attorneys in their current classifications; and

WHEREAS, the County Board has considered that the active involvement in handling cases by the Attorney Division Chiefs is such that these classifications could be utilized in creating new classifications within the County Attorney's Office and is an option considered by the County Board; and

WHEREAS, the County Board considered the salaries paid to Assistant County Attorneys in comparable counties as noted in Attachment 1 and noted that the 2013 average low salary is \$57,670 compared to the Blue Earth County low salary of \$58,074 and that consideration of comparable counties does not warrant any change in the starting salary for a Blue Earth Assistant County Attorney; and

WHEREAS, the County Board considered that the 2013 average high salary is \$92,647 of comparable counties as noted in Attachment 1 compared to the Blue Earth County high salary of \$77,293 and that consideration of this factor potentially warrants adjustment to the high wage that a Blue Earth Assistant County Attorney may earn; and

WHEREAS, the attached documents summarize the various options considered by the Board based on the low and high compensation for comparable counties; and

WHEREAS, the County Board has determined under Option 1 and Option 2, the County would retain the same starting salary for Assistant Blue Earth County Attorney I in an amount that exceeds the average starting wage in the comparable counties; and

WHEREAS, the County Board has determined that the attached Option 1 would result in the 2013 range top as of July 1, 2013 established at \$93,018 and that this amount would exceed the average high wage in the comparable counties of \$92,647 and; and

WHEREAS, the County Board has determined that attached Option 2 would result in the 2013 range top as of July 1, 2013 established at \$100,443 and that this amount would significantly exceed the average high wage in the comparable counties of \$92,647 but would be reflective of the additional duties and responsibilities associated with an Assistant County III in terms of supervision and acting in a Lead capacity to such an extent that it would replace the Attorney Division Chiefs over time; and

WHEREAS, the County Board has determined that attached Option 2 would further recognize the division of duties and responsibilities held by the incumbent Attorney Division Chiefs as they actively practice and handle caseloads on behalf of the County Attorney's Office, would include the incumbent Attorney Division Chiefs at the Assistant County Attorney III classification but would not limit their salary to the high salary in recognition of their current duties and responsibilities and compensation; and

WHEREAS, in determining the appropriate placement of incumbent Assistant County Attorneys, the County Board recognizes that the affected incumbents had the following experience:

WHEREAS, Option 2 would leave the County Attorney with the ability to recommend which incumbent would occupy the one open Assistant County Attorney III classification, which three incumbents would occupy the open Assistant County Attorney II classifications and which three incumbents would continue as Assistant County Attorney I based on the individual qualifications, performance and experience as required for the respective classifications; and

WHEREAS, in the event that Option 2 was selected, this County Attorney recommendation would be submitted to the County Board for individual placement in the classifications based on the employee's experience, qualifications and performance consistent with this Resolution;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the County Board hereby establishes the Assistant County Salary Determinations for budget years 2012 and 2013 as outlined in Option \_\_\_ attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said payments shall be made in the event that the District Court's Order is not reversed or modified on appeal or as otherwise directed by the District Court; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Administrator is authorized to take the necessary steps to direct this Resolution to the District Court.

Blue Earth County shall establish two (2) classifications of Assistant County Attorney. Assistant County Attorneys will have an expanded salary range based upon a career ladder style progression from one classification to the higher classification. The position titles will be Assistant County Attorney I (ACAI) and Assistant County Attorney II (ACAI). Upon hire Assistant County Attorneys will be classified at the ACAI level (C52). ## Option 2

Blue Earth County shall establish three (3) classifications of Assistant County Attorney. The position titles will be Assistant County Attorney I (ACAI), Assistant County Attorney II (ACAI) and Assistant County Attorney III (ACAIII). There is to be a dedicated number of positions in each classification. The County will maintain a complement of three ACAIs, three (3) ACA IIs and three (3) ACA IIIs. ACAIs will be classified at a C52 level. ACAIIs will be classified at a D62 level. ACAIIIs serving in a supervisory/lead position will be classified at a D63 level. The ACAIII position will over time replace the current division chief positions through attrition. Advancement from one classification to another will be based upon a vacancy in a higher classification and if all advancement conditions are met.

Based upon documented deficiencies in performance, the promotion may be revoked at any time prior to completion of the probation period. In such case, the employee will be returned to the classification placement in existence prior to the promotion.
